A Summary of Israel's Theology of Land

- a. Israel's land is a gift from Yahweh in fulfillment of his covenant promises to the ancestors (v. 9).
- b. Israel's land offers the covenant people a paradise-like context in which to fulfill their destiny (vv. 9–11).
- Israel's land is the special object of Yahweh's election and his perpetual care (v. 12).
- Israel's land offers the people a geographic context for an ethical response to the covenant (vv. 8, 13, 22).
- e. Israel's land fulfills its intended role within the triangular covenant relationship only as Yahweh providentially enables it to do so (vv. 14–17).
- f. Israel's possession of the land is contingent on Yahweh's giving it to the people, which in turn is contingent on their fidelity to the covenant (vv. 22– 25).

Deuteronomy 8:7-9

For Yahweh your God is bringing you into a good *land*, a *land* of brooks of water, of fountains and springs, flowing out in the valleys and hills, a *land* of wheat and barley, of vines and fig trees and pomegranates, a *land* of olive trees and honey, a *land* in which you will eat bread without scarcity, in which you will lack nothing, a *land* whose stones are iron,

and out of whose hills you can dig copper.

Deuteronomy 11:9b-12

and that you may live long
in the *land* that Yahweh swore to your fathers
to give to them and to their offspring,
a *land* flowing with milk and honey,

indeed the *land* that you are entering to take possession of it is not like the land of Egypt, from which you have come, where you sowed your seed and irrigated it, like a garden of vegetables. but the *land* that you are going over to possess is a *land* of hills and valleys, which drinks water by the rain from heaven, a *land* that Yahweh your God cares for. The eyes of Yahweh your God are always upon it, from the beginning of the year to the end of the year.

A Comparison of the Land of Egypt and the Land of Canaan

Egypt:

Land where seed is sown Land watered by foot

Canaan:

Land sworn to Israel by YHWH
Land flowing with milk and honey
Land of hills and Valleys
Land that drinks water from the sky
Land for which YHWH cares
Land on which YHWH's eyes are


