The Order of the Traditional Seder

 - (b) Cook the meat of the animal (7a).
 - (c) Eat the Passover (7b)

 - (a) The key feature: no unleavened bread for six days after the Passover Sabbath
 - (b) The significance of the unleavened bread: reminder of slavery in Egypt (3-4)
