A. YHWH's Introductory Speech (31:16–19)

- 1. The Problem: Israel's Apparently Inevitable Apostasy (vv. 16–18)
 - a. The Context of the Apostasy: The Death of Moses (v. 16a)
 - b. The Stages of Israel's Apostasy (vv. 16–18)
 - (1) "This people" will arise (cf. Exod 32:6)
 - (2) They will "go whoring" after other gods.
 - (3) They will abandon (עַזֶב) YHWH.
 - (4) They will break YHWH's covenant (בַּרִיתִי that he made with them (בַּרָתִּי אָתוֹ).
 - (5) YHWH will be enraged.
 - (6) Many "disasters" [רְעוֹת] and troubles (צֵרוֹת] will "find" (מָצָא) and "consume" (אָבַל) them.
 - (7) The people will react with bitterness and anger toward YHWH.
 - (8) YHWH will remain resolute (v. 18).

Deuteronomy 31:16-18 **Deuteronomy 31:20-21** ¹⁶And YHWH said to Moses, ²⁰ Because I will bring them into the land "Look, you are about to lie down with your fathers. flowing with milk and honey, which I swore to give to their fathers, Then this people will rise and they will eat and they will whore after the foreign gods and they will be full among them in the land and they will grow fat, that they are entering, and they will turn to other gods and they will forsake me and they will serve them, and they will break my covenant and they will despise me that I have made with them. and they will break my covenant. ¹⁷ Then my anger will be kindled against them ²¹ And when many evils and troubles in that day, have come upon them, and I will forsake them then this song shall answer before them as a witness and I will hide my face from them, (for it will not be forgotten and they will be devoured. in the mouths of their offspring). And many evils and troubles will come upon them, For I know their inclination so that they will say in that day, which they demonstrate even today, 'Have not these evils come upon us before I have brought them into the land because our God is not among us?' that I swore to give." ¹⁸ And I will surely hide my face in that day because of all the evil that they have done, because they have turned to other gods.
