B. Nature of Ezekiel's Commission

- 1. While he was on his face he heard the sound of someone's voice, saying, "Human, stand that I may speak with you."
- 2. The opening words, "I am sending you" is used regularly of envoys (*mal'akîm*), sent out by a higher authority to deliver a message to a third party on the sender's behalf.
- 3. The LORD authorizes Ezekiel to use what is commonly recognized as the "messenger citation formula": "I am sending you to them, and you shall say to them, 'Thus has the Lord YHWH declared. . . ."
- 4. The LORD predicts that when Ezekiel's prophecies are fulfilled his people will know "that a prophet has been in their midst."

- 1. The LORD promises to put a hedge around the prophet for the difficult road ahead.
- 2. The LORD promises to provide Ezekiel with the script for his utterances.

Application

- 1. Whoever would serve as a messenger of God must recognize that the calling comes from God alone.
- 2. Whoever would serve as God's messenger must first have a clear vision of the one who sends him/her.
- 3. Whoever would serve as God's messenger must be empowered by the Spirit of God.
- 4. Whoever would serve as the messenger of God must be inspired by the message of God.
- 5. Whoever would serve as the messenger of God will be divinely equipped commensurate with the calling.
- 6. Whoever would serve as the messenger of God must recognize that the calling is not to success but to faithfulness.
