  - (1) YHWH will make the gold and silver odious (*niddâ*) to those who have misused it.
  - (2) YHWH will personally deliver the precious metals and other property into the hands of the most ruthless of enemies.
  - (3) YHWH will permit the invaders to desecrate the land.
  - (4) YHWH will permit the population to be led away into exile (v. 23).
  - (5) YHWH will break the power of the strong and desecrate their holy places (v. 24).

### Application
