

Announcing the Demise of the Kraken of the Nile**Ezekiel 29:1–16****Veritas Adult Community****December 5, 2020**

¹In the tenth year, in the tenth [month], on the twelfth [day] of the month, the following message of YHWH came to me: ²Human, direct your face toward Pharaoh, king of Egypt, and prophesy against him and against all Egypt. ³Speak, and declare:

Thus has the Lord YHWH declared:

Look, I am against you, O Pharaoh, king of Egypt, the great monster, sprawled out in the midst of his channels, who says, “My Nile belongs to me; I made [it] for myself.” ⁴But I will place hooks in your jaws and make the fish of your channels stick to your scales. I will haul you up from your channels, with all the fish of your channels sticking to your scales.

⁵I will hurl you out into the wilderness—
you and all the fish of your channels.

On the open field you will fall;

You will not be gathered,

And you will not be collected.

To wild animals of the earth

And birds of the heavens

I have consigned you as food.

⁶Then all who live in Egypt will know that I am YHWH.

Because you are a reed crutch to the house of Israel—

⁷When they grasp you, you splinter in their hand,
and totally tear up their armpits.

When they lean on you, you shatter,

causing their hips to collapse—

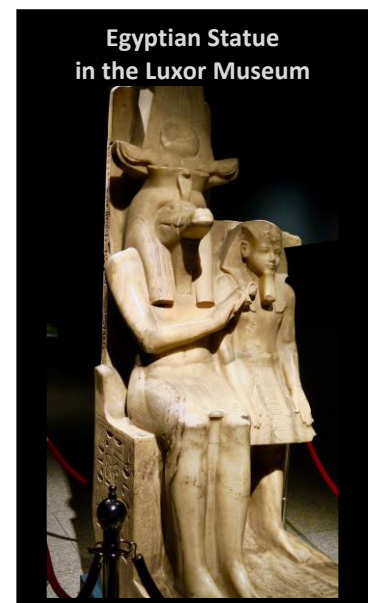
⁸Therefore, thus has the Lord YHWH declared:

I will bring a sword against you and cut off from you both human and animal. ^{9a}Then the land of Egypt will be a desolate wasteland, and they will know that I am YHWH.”

^{9b}Because you said, “The Nile belongs to me; I made it.”

¹⁰Therefore I am against you and against your river channels. I will turn the land of Egypt into an utterly desolate wasteland, from Migdol to Syene, as far as the Nubian frontier. ¹¹No foot, human or animal, will pass through it. It will remain uninhabited for forty years. ¹²I will turn the land of Egypt into the most desolate of all desolate lands, and her cities will be the most desolate among ruined cities—for forty years. And I will scatter the Egyptians among the nations and disperse them among the lands.

¹³That is—thus has the Lord YHWH declared—at the end of forty years, I will gather Egypt from among the peoples where they have been scattered. ¹⁴I will restore the fortunes of Egypt, and bring them back to the land of Pathros, the land of their origin. There they will be a lowly kingdom. ¹⁵It will be the lowliest of kingdoms and will never again assert itself over the nations. I will keep them small so they never again lord it over the nations. ¹⁶Never again will they serve as an object of trust for the house of Israel—a reminder of guilt they incurred when they turned toward them. Then they will know that I am the Lord YHWH.
