The Renewal of YHWH's Eternal Covenant with All Israel

¹⁵ The following message of YHWH came to me: ¹⁶ As for you, human, take a single piece of wood and write on it, 'Pertaining to Judah and to the sons of Israel who are associated with him." Then take a second piece of wood and write on it, 'Pertaining to Joseph and to the entire family of Israel associated with him." ¹⁷ Set them side by side for yourself to create a single piece of wood. They shall form a single entity in your hand. ¹⁸ Now when your compatriots ask you, "Will you not explain to us what these things mean to you?" ¹⁹ then you shall respond, "Thus has the Lord YHWH has declared:

'Look! I am taking the wood of Joseph—which is in Ephraim's hand— along with the tribes of Israel, which are associated with him, and placing them upon it, that is on the wood of Judah, and I will make them into a single piece of wood. And they will form a single entity in my hand.'

20 Let the pieces of wood on which you write lie in your hand for them to see."

²¹ Now declare to them, "Thus has the Lord YHWH declared: 'Look! I will take the descendants of Israel from the nations among which they have gone. I will regather them from all around and bring them back to their own land. ²² I will make them into a single nation within the land, on the mountains of Israel. Then a single king will be king for all of them. Never again will they be two nations, and never again will they be divided into two kingdoms. ²³ Never again will they defile themselves with their pellets of dung, with their disgusting practices, or their rebellious actions. I will rescue them from all their apostasies, by which they sinned, and I will cleanse them. Then they will be my people, and I will be their God. ²⁴ And my servant David will be king over them, and there will be a single shepherd for all of them."


Then in my stipulations they will walk and my ordinances they will observe and put them into practice. ²⁵ They will occupy the land I gave to my servant Jacob, and in which your ancestors lived. They, their children, and their grandchildren will occupy it forever. And David my servant will be their prince forever. ²⁶ I will make with them a covenant of peace; it will be an eternal covenant with them. I will give to them [the land of Israel] and multiply them. I will place my sanctuary in their midst forever. ²⁷ My residence will be over them, and I will be their God and they will be my people. ²⁸ And when my sanctuary is in their midst forever, then the nations will know that I am YHWH, the one who sanctifies Israel.

Exposition

Introduction

The Relationship between 37:1-14 and 31:15-28

- 1. The sign-act involving two pieces of wood representing the southern and northern kingdoms answers directly to the first objection raised (v. 11).
- 2. The reference to "the whole house of Israel" in verse 16 deliberately picks up the same expression we saw in verse 11, except that now it refers unambiguously to the northern tribes of Israel.
- 3. YHWH reiterates his promises in verses 12b ("I will bring you into the land of Israel" and 14b ("I will place you in your own land.
- 4. This is another example of "halving" prophecies by presenting them in two comparable panels (here 14 verses each; 212 words vs. 236 words), with the second presenting a response to the first.
