Bible text explored: Acts 2:42-47

⁴²And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. ⁴³And awe came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles. ⁴⁴And all who believed were together and had all things in common. ⁴⁵And they were selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to all, as any had need. ⁴⁶And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they received their food with glad and generous hearts, ⁴⁷praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved. [ESV]

Review and application:

Today's text is the first of three vignettes Luke wrote describing the new community of Jesus followers in Jerusalem. You can follow the second one in 4:32-35; the third is in 5:12-16. In these vignettes of the early church, Luke is contrasting the vibrant community of Jesus with the increasingly corrupt and merely human religiosity of the temple man.

The Temple of Man

- 1. At first (v. 46), the new community's worship was centered in the expansive courtyard of the Temple. (See also *Acts 3:1, 11* and *5:12b.*) What were some of the elements that characterized the temple man's merely human religiosity? (See *Acts 4:1-2, 16-17* and *5:17-18.*)
- 2. How did beggars at the Temple (*Acts 3:2*) demonstrate traditional religion's failure to care for the poor?

The Community of Jesus

- 3. The first element of this new community was *the gospel* on which it was based. What (*Acts 2:36*) was the Spirit-empowered message Peter delivered to the gathered Pentecost crowd?
 - What (*Acts 2:37*) demonstrated the conviction that gripped his audience? How (*Acts 2:38-39*) did Peter instruct them to respond? How compelling (*Acts 2:41*) was the crowd's follow-through?
- 4. How (v.42) did this good news shape the activities of this rapidly growing community?
- 5. The second element (*v. 43*) was *spiritual power*. While the Spirit used these wonders and signs to demonstrate God's stamp of approval on the new community, have you witnessed a divine intervention in our day? How (*v. 47*) did this affect how the community was perceived? (See also, *Acts 5:12-16*.)
- 6. The third element (vv. 44-45) was radical generosity. How did this community provide for converts who lacked basic needs?What (v. 46b) motivated this voluntary action?How did this fulfill God's intention for his people? (See Deut. 15:4.)
- 7. What (47b) is the natural outcome in a joyful community that is mutually supportive? (See also *Acts 5:14*.)
